PROJECT OVERSEAS 2019

Teachers' Action for Teaching

PROJECT OVERSEAS (PO) is a joint endeavor of the Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF) and its Member organizations to support overseas partners in developing countries as they deliver professional services to teachers.

Since 1962, PO has assisted teacher organizations in over fifty countries in Africa, Asia and the Pacific, and the Caribbean. PO currently places over 50 volunteers in approximately ten countries every July. Financial support is provided by the CTF and its provincial and territorial teacher organizations.

Burkina Faso, Ghana, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Sierra Leone, Togo, and Uganda.

MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAM

PO is a key part of the CTF's International and Social Justice Program. Through the "Teachers' Action for Learning", it focuses on *Teachers' Action for*.

- Teaching Canadian teachers work with local teachers overseas to strengthen teacher competence.
- Teacher Organizations The program assists overseas partner organizations as they strengthen their capacity to provide professional services to their members.
- Gender Equality All PO programs address gender equality for teachers, assist in the development of girlfriendly school environments and work to eliminate school based gender violence.

PO is often an integral part of long term projects that strengthen quality, publicly funded education.

TERMS OF THE ASSIGNMENT

- Volunteers must be prepared to be assigned to any location where there is a CTF project.
- Volunteers must be available for assignments during the month of July.
- Volunteers can expect to work hard both in and out of the classroom and collaborate with a local teacher.
- Family members and friends cannot accompany the participant.
- Volunteers will be part of a team, which is usually led by an experienced Project Overseas participant.
- Volunteers usually share living accommodations with other PO participants.
- Volunteers do not receive a salary, but travel and basic living expenses are covered by the CTF.



SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS

Applications are received and reviewed by the CTF Member organizations in early fall. Recommended applications are forwarded to the CTF.

Participants are chosen on the basis of advice from Member organizations and the expressed needs of the overseas partner organizations. Successful applicants are notified of their assignments in January.

CRITERIA FOR APPLICATION

Applications are welcome from any Canadian teacher who is a member of a provincial or territorial teacher organization which sponsors PO, and meets the following requirements:

All candidates must:

- be Canadian citizens;
- hold a Canadian passport valid until at least July 2020, at the time of application (Proof that a
 passport application has been made will be accepted.);
- be members of a provincial or territorial teacher organization that supports PO;
- hold a valid teachers' certificate;
- have completed at least five years of teaching in Canada by July 2019;
- be in excellent health and able to work in developing country conditions;
- have high standards of professionalism and personal conduct;
- show evidence of flexibility and mature judgment;
- be willing to put the team and project needs above personal needs.
