







## OECTA AIDE, Human Rights, & Related Resources





### OECTA VIDEO RESOURCES



	<p>The <b>Your Professional Obligations: Understanding the Impact of the N-word in Catholic Schools, A Guide for Catholic Teachers</b> is intended to help Catholic teachers understand the harm caused by the use of the N-word in a school context, and the impact it has on Black learners who attend Catholic schools.</p>	
	<p>The <b>OECTA Identity Wheel</b> is a tool to for members and association leaders consider their own positionality.</p>	

## OECTA SAFER SPACES SERIES

	<p>The <b>Safer Spaces? Braver Spaces? Our Collective Responsibility</b> resource outlines the challenges of safe spaces and brave spaces and contextualizes the need for these considerations to be responsive to teacher responsibilities under the law, while encouraging reflection on your own leadership and/or teaching practice.</p>	
	<p>The resource <b>Intent vs. Impact</b> explores that we cannot know or assume that the individual(s) we are communicating with are receiving our message(s) as intended. This resource considers navigation difficult conversations, and what to do when someone says your words have caused harm</p>	
	<p>This resource overviews the <b>Moral Elements of Care</b>: Attentiveness, Responsibility, Competence, Responsiveness, and Solidarity as articulated by educational theorist Joan Toronto. It includes reflection questions for teachers in Catholic schools.</p>	
	<p>The resource <b>Allyship and Beyond</b> reviews the term 'allyship' and breaks it into three phases: allies, accomplices, and co-conspirators, applying the work of Dr. Tiffany Jana (they/them) to OECTA contexts.</p>	
	<p>The <b>Reflection Tool: Identity and Allyship</b> can be used in workshops, or for personal professional consideration</p>

<p><b>Human Rights Complaint Form</b></p>	<p><a href="#">OECTA has a Human Rights Intake Process</a> which provides members with an opportunity to identify an instance (or instances) where they believe that their human rights, as recognized in the Ontario Human Rights Code, have been violated.</p>
